1996

September

Focus: Signing Agreement

After a visit to Chicago former Paris mayor, President Jacques Chirac proposed to Mayor Richard M. Daley that Chicago and Paris enter into a sister cities agreement. The agreement was solidified in Paris in September 1996.

1997

Focus: Government

First Deputy Mayor of Paris, Jacques Dominati, accompanied a small delegation, to Chicago. Meetings focused on ideas for alleviating traffic congestion in Paris and parking alternatives. In addition, the Paris Committee hosted a benefit dinner at Bistro 110 featuring the renowned Chef Joel Robuchon. Funds provide seed money for future sister cities projects.

Paris Committee members cheered on French runners during the Chicago marathon at Paris Patisserie, a restaurant in Lincoln Park. The number of French runners increased from seven in 1996 to more than 150 in 1997 due to a member of the Paris Committee solicited French runners during the Paris marathon.

1999

Focus: Social Services

The Paris Committee arranged the itinerary for Madame Giscard d’Estaing, former first lady of France and founder of the Foundation pour l’Enfrance, which focused on meetings with leaders and innovators in the field of child welfare.

The Trade and Business Subcommittee met with counterpart subcommittee members from Paris who represent the Paris Development Agency to discuss potential projects.

2000

Focus: Culture

The Paris Committee held a fundraiser called *Chefs de Paris*, which celebrated Chicago's finest French chefs; the chefs offered samplings of their creations at Symphony Center. A scholarship was awarded to a Kendall College student.

Focus: Economic Development

In collaboration with Invest in France Agency, the Paris Committee organized a trade mission to Paris for Chicagoland biotechnology companies. Trip participants had the opportunity to establish contacts with French pharmaceutical companies, research institutes, regulatory bodies, and venture capital firms; meet with French biotech companies in one-on-one partnering meetings; visit the genopole® d'Evry Biotech Park and Paris Biotech Park; showcase Illinois Biotech companies at the new BIOTEC Europe 2000 expo & conferences in Paris, and enhance relationships between the Illinois Biotech and French Biotech communities.

Chicago companies participated in a series of one-on-one meetings with more than 70 French firms. As a result of these sessions, several overseas partnerships are seriously being negotiated. The trip was made possible with support from The Chicago Partnership for Economic Development, Deloitte & Touche, Illinois Trade Office, McDonnell Boehnen Hulbert & Berghoff, and United Airlines.

Tickets were \$40 in advance, \$50 at the door. A raffle was held with a number of prizes, including a Sofitel package valued at \$500, an Alliance Francaise language package, a spa gift basket, a wine gift basket valued at \$150, two certificates for a truffle-making class at Katherine Anne Confections, a piece of art valued at \$500 and other prizes. Raffle tickets were \$10, 3 for \$25. About 100 tickets were sold, with close to \$5000 raised, meeting the goal.

March 4-15

The Paris and Hamburg Committees of CSCI in partnership with the Consulates General of France and the Federal Republic of Germany celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Élysée Treaty by presenting an exhibition of the history of the Treaty in the lobby of the Daley Center.

April 26

Focus: Culture

The Paris Committee of CSCI hosted the inaugural concert of The Bridge, a network of jazz musicians from Chicago and France who come together to promote transatlantic musical exchange, at the Chicago Cultural Center.

The Bridge was founded to encourage all aspects of musical collaboration, including touring, recording and documenting jazz and improvisational music across cultures. A network of sixty artists from the U.S. and France have combined forces to promote cross-cultural musical exploration through performances, educational workshops, public discussions & debates and master classes.

Featured performers included Fred Jackson & Stéphane Payen on the alto saxophone and Edward Perraud & Frank Rosaly on the drums.

August 5-9

Focus: Culture

The 8th Annual Chicago Sister Cities International Festival transformed Daley Plaza into an international village filled with merchants, food, music, and dance from Chicago's 28 Sister Cities. Merchant Provence Village Ltd sold traditional and authentic French merchandise representing the culture and heritage of Paris.

In October 2013, the Rector of l'Academie de Paris, M. Francois Weil, visited Chicago with a delegation of French school principals and colleagues to meet with Mrs. Barbara Byrd-Bennett, Chief Executive Officer of Chicago Public Schools.

Mrs. Byrd-Bennett stressed the importance of cooperation between Chicago and Paris, both cities having similar visions of academic excellence and the mutual hope to improve education in an ever-changing global society. Mr. Weil spoke of the common priorities of our two cities, i.e. the importance of art and culture as teaching tools, the development of digital learning, and the need for diminishing inequality. He firmly believes that the dialog between educators and students from both sides of the Atlantic will be of great benefit to the future of society.

Mr. Weil also spoke at the University of Chicago and Northwestern University about the existing international exchanges at these two institutions and the hope to further develop this kind of communication at the university level as well.

The Paris delegation completed its visit to Chicago with a four-hour round table discussion at the French Consulate attended by members of the Chicago Public Schools, principals and administrators from the Career & Technical Education Department, French Jules Verne scholarship recipients, members of the French Consulate and of the Paris Committee of Chicago Sister Cities International. This most informative and exciting interchange outlined the work ahead and inspired everyone to continue this mission with enthusiasm.

The Paris Social Services Committee planned an interdisciplinary, intercultural week of activities that helped to build partnerships and provide opportunities for dialogue and sharing of best practices among social service professionals from Chicago and Paris.

This included visits to various sites in Chicago, including: After School Matters, the Chicago Alliance to End Homelessness, the Chicago Department of Family and Support Services, Children's Home + Aid Society, the Heartland Alliance, Inspiration Café, the Jane Addams Hull House Museum, Lawrence Hall Youth Services, Metropolitan Family Services, Mujeres Latinas en Acción, the National Immigrant Justice Center, New Moms Supportive Housing, Panera Cares, Primo Center for Women and Children, the University of Illinois at Chicago, World Language High School and Youth Guidance.

On the final day of the exchange, there was a debriefing session in which the Paris Social Services Committee and the Parisian delegates reflected on the week's activities and how the knowledge gained will help them in their professions here in Chicago and back home in Paris.

The Committee, in conjunction with the City of Paris, is gearing up for the next exchange in the Spring of 2015, in which Chicago social services professionals will travel to Paris to be immersed into their social service networks.

Chicago City Council passed resolutions to mark the anniversaries of four of Chicago's sister city relationships: 25 years with Kyiv, Ukraine; Mexico City, Mexico; and Toronto, Canada; and 20 years with Paris, France. Mayor Rahm Emanuel was present to congratulate the Consuls General and the respective sister city committee chairs.

February 25

The Advisory Board of Chicago Sister Cities International approved a resolution to require each sister city committee to have two individuals serve as co-chairs. Previous vice-chair David Reithoffer is now the co-chair of the Paris Committee.

Across from the Eiffel Tower on the Avenue du Président Kennedy at the 30 kilometer point, thousands of people gathered to shout and cheer.
