

U.S. STATE DEPARTMENT IN MOROCCO INVITES
CHICAGO MUSICIAN MICHAEL J. MILES
FOR RETURN CONCERT TOUR

WHAT: At the invitation of the U.S. State Department in Morocco, Chicago musician, Michael Miles, will lead a 7-city concert tour of Morocco, collaborating with American & Moroccan musicians.

WHEN: January 25 through February 4, 2010

WHERE: 7 Moroccan cities---Casablanca, Marrakech, Beni Mellal, etc.

At the invitation of the U.S. State Dept. in Morocco, Michael Miles will be returning to Morocco for 7-city concert tour. Miles is a Chicago-based musician, composer and educator. He is recognized as one of the country's leading innovators on the 5-string banjo and is artist-in-residence at the famed Old Town School of Folk Music. Also a vocalist and guitarist, Miles has earned tremendous critical acclaim, collaborating with numerous world class musicians.

Miles will be touring with Chicago-based drummer, Tony Dale, as well as Moroccan multi-instrumentalist, Abdellah El Miry. The tour includes additional collaborations with local musicians along its route, including a special event with world-renowned oud player, Haj Younes of Casablanca.

In addition to the concerts planned, Miles will visit Moroccan schools in preparation for a musical exchange between Chicago public school students and Moroccan students via web conferencing. The student exchange is a part of the "Global Voices" program created by Arlene Crewdson, former Executive Director and founder of Chicago's Pegasus Players Theatre.
